People of America! In King v. Burwell, the Supreme Court changed the express words of the legislation
passed by the U.S. Congress, and substituted their will for the Law. The very next day, in Obergefell v.
Hodges, the Supreme Court again broke trust and usurped the Constitutional jurisdiction of the states and the
people, and rewrote 5,000 years of an established definition of marriage and fabricated Constitutional
protections for a deviant class it supported. In the words of Justice Antonin Scalia in his Obergefell dissent,
"This is a naked judicial claim to legislative—indeed, super-legislative—power; a claim fundamentally at
odds with our system of government...A system of government that makes the People subordinate to a
committee of nine unelected lawyers does not deserve to be called a democracy." "Breaking Trust with the
